SEWER SEPARATION BIDS

Previously bids were open for Olive Street sewer repair. Hebert Construction was the low bid of \$17,200.00, however his bid specified 8" sewer line and the ad asked for 10" sewer line. Manager King has been in contact with Mr. Hebert and he said he would put 10" sewer line in for the price that was quoted.

After some discussion, Safford moved to approve T&T Excavating bid as per specifications, for \$22,300.00 for the replacement of 560 feet of 10" sewer line on Olive St. Coates supported the motion.

Veterans donation will be raised to \$250 and taken off of community promotions and the Public Works – gas and oil will be increased to \$30,000.
